Vintage 2021 Notes: The Great Southern had a great start to the growing season with

a full soil moisture profile at the end of September, resulting in good canopy growth. This set the tone for the rest of the vintage. Ripening was significantly slower this year, which saw harvest begin 4 weeks later compared to 2020 vintage, more indicative of cool climate viticulture. January was warm and dry, and a short burst of rain (approx. 60mm) in February graced the Great Southern with almost perfect conditions. Overall, the Great Southern experienced exceptional vintage conditions during

2021 harvest.

Winemaking Notes: Whole bunches were hand picked in early March. These bunches

were then destemmed into small fermenters and regularly pumped over to ensure gentle extraction of flavour and colour. The fermentation temperature was carefully controlled and allowed to hit a peak of 28C. Once fermentation was complete, the wine was transferred into 4 and 5 year old French oak barrels

for 9 months.

WINE CHARACTERISTICS

Colour: Brilliant garnet.

Nose: Violet floral bouquet with a touch of spiciness.

Palate: Medium bodied with spice and pepper, balanced tannins,

medium acidity and plush cherry characters make this a crowd

pleasing wine.

Food Pairing: Enjoy the Independence Grenache by itself or with slow cooked

beef cheeks.
